*The name of our group:*

A. Aim:

To get as many animals as possible to finish in the first three.

B. Scoring:

You get one point for each animal you get in the first three, no matter if they finish as the first, the second or the third. You get the point even if other groups have entered the same animal in that category.

■ Look at the categories everyone was given in the group and the information you have. Decide which categories you would like to enter animals in. The more animals you enter for the Olympics, the more chance for you to win!

C. Entering animals for the Olympics:

To enter an animal for the Olympics, you need to fill in an Entry Form for the animal. You can enter a maximum of four animals per category.

D. Judges:

Your group will act as judges in a minimum of one of the categories. It means that you will decide which of the animals are in the finals (first four) in that category, and establish their order (4<sup>th</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup>). You will calculate points for groups in that category. Groups get one point for each animal in the first three. You cannot enter any animal in that category.
